The trustees of Aylesbury and District Fund for the Deaf (the Charity) are also trustees of Oxford Diocesan Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, which is also a registered charity (no. 203428).

The Chairperson is responsible for the day to day management of the charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Charity status

Aylesbury and District Fund for the Deaf was registered with the Charity Commission (no. 236523) on 10 September 1964. The Charity is administered by Oxford Diocesan Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

Decision-making structure

The trustees are responsible for the management of funds, the preparation and management of the budget and advising and reporting on all of the charity's operational activities.

Appointment of trustees

The trustees are the trustees of Oxford Diocesan Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and are appointed in a number of different ways as follows.

Ex officio: The following post holders are ex officio trustees by virtue of their position:

The Bishop of Oxford, an Archdeacon or Area Bishop appointed by the Bishop of Oxford, the

Chairperson, the Treasurer (if honorary) and the Secretary (if honorary).

Elected: Two trustees are elected as representatives of the Oxford Diocesan Synod.

Nominated: One trustee is nominated by each of the four Archdeaconries as its representative.

Appointed: The Chair is appointed by the Bishop of Oxford.

Two trustees are appointed to represent the Oxford Diocesan Board of Finance but only if the

Charity remains an 'assisted organisation'.

Co-opted: Up to three trustees may be co-opted.

There is currently no Honorary Treasurer or Honorary Secretary.

Trustees' remuneration and expenses

No trustees receive any remuneration from the Charity. The Chairperson is reimbursed for expenses incurred on behalf of the Charity and all trustees are entitled to claim for the cost of attending meetings

Related parties

Oxford Diocesan Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing

The trustees of the Charity are also trustees of Oxford Diocesan Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, which is a separate charity that administers the Charity.

Risk management

The trustees have reviewed the Charity's activities and plans to identify significant risks to which the Charity is exposed. Systems have been established to manage those risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Aims and objectives

The Charity's purpose is to promote the spiritual, social and general wellbeing of people who are deaf and hard of hearing in Aylesbury and its neighbourhood.

Achievements and performance

The chaplains and lay ministers have maintained a regular pattern of worship in the Deaf Church and the use of modern technology continues to be used and developed to enhance deaf church worship at the major festivals.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT 2018/19 (continued) OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES (continued)

A new half-time Lead Chaplain (the post being shared 50:50 as the Diocesan Disability Adviser) was appointed on 18th March 2019. She is paid directly by the Diocese of Oxford, so neither her pay nor related expenses are shown on these accounts.

Investment performance

The Charity's funds are held in the CBF Investment Fund which generated a yield, based on average value over the year, of 6.1% (2017/18: 6.4%). The investment increased in value during the year by 8.9% (2017/18 increased by 2.3%)

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Summary of result for the year

Incoming resources totalled £1,509 in the year; resources expended amounted to £2,904 so that the result was a deficit for the year of £1,395. The Charity's investments increased in value during the year by £3,615 so that the Charity's funds increased by a total of £1,177 during the year.

Investment policy

The trustees' investment objective is to obtain a steady income stream, sustainable in real terms over time, whilst maintaining the real capital value of the funds with some prospect for growth in the longer term.

Reserves policy

The level of reserves is considered appropriate as they are sufficient to allow the trustees to manage difficult financial setbacks and the income from the invested reserves provides a significant part of the Charity's total income stream.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The trustees intend to continue the Charity's current activities.

APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

A resolution to reappoint Mr A Churchill Stone as independent examiner will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

EXPENDITURE

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

FUND ACCOUNTING

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

PENSION COSTS AND OTHER POST-RETIREMENT BENEFITS

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
